The True Impact of No Preparation

Staff Members:

Poor response to an emergency can leave staff feeling inadequate, guilty, stressed, anxious, depressed, isolated, embarrassed and suffer post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). This will often lead to staff resigning, needing mental health support or ongoing medical support for months, and in some cases years.

The impact on staff who are not ready to manage an emergency is massive. It may not only impact those involved but other staff members who could feel let down, mistreated and undervalued due to lack of training by management.









Customers:

When there are customers involved, they may get an injury, or worse, due to poor emergency responses. In the worst-case scenario, customers may never return to your business, or they may tell others to keep away from your business. They may even speak to the media without all the facts, or take legal action against the business and staff involved.

Impact on the Community:

Public/community perception of your business can be destroyed by rumour, media, or disgruntled staff. Your business reputation can be destroyed forcing business closure. Swim School business owners/company directors can face bankruptcy, heavy fines in the hundreds of thousands, or jail time if found guilty of negligence.
